Project Challenge

The Town of Denton on the mostly agricultural Eastern Shore of Maryland developed traditionally over time. Many new developments have not responded to the rich village patt ern and prevalent regional architectural styles. 850 acres on the west side of the Choptank River is invisaged to develop into an expansion of the town, and contain residential, retail, civic, open space, commercial, and waterfront access. The developer wished to preserve most of the waterfront environment as public open space, choosing to build on a limited area. The large size and scope of this project requires it be viewed as an extension of the town and as a new gateway.

Project Description

The Master Plan for West Denton utilizes the site's physical features and environmental constraints as assets and sensatively incorporates them into the overall plan. Another factor in the plan is the use of Denton's street patt ern, which further enhances the town's expansion plans as being consistent with context. Approximately 50% of residents will be 'active adults', those folk over fi ft y-fi ve years of age wishing to work, recreate, and participate in vital town activities. An intensively built neighborhood will function as town center, containing neighborhood services such as grocery, live/work, medical, police, and community open space.

Value Added

The team's ability to identify and incorporate existing site assets such as Bald Eagle and beaver habitat, wetland and hedgerows into a workable and realistic plan resulted in an implementable plan worthy of historic Eastern Shore development patt erns. With a healthy respect for the Chesapeake Bay Watershed, the Town of Denton is ready to grow respectful of water quality and ecosystem needs.
